

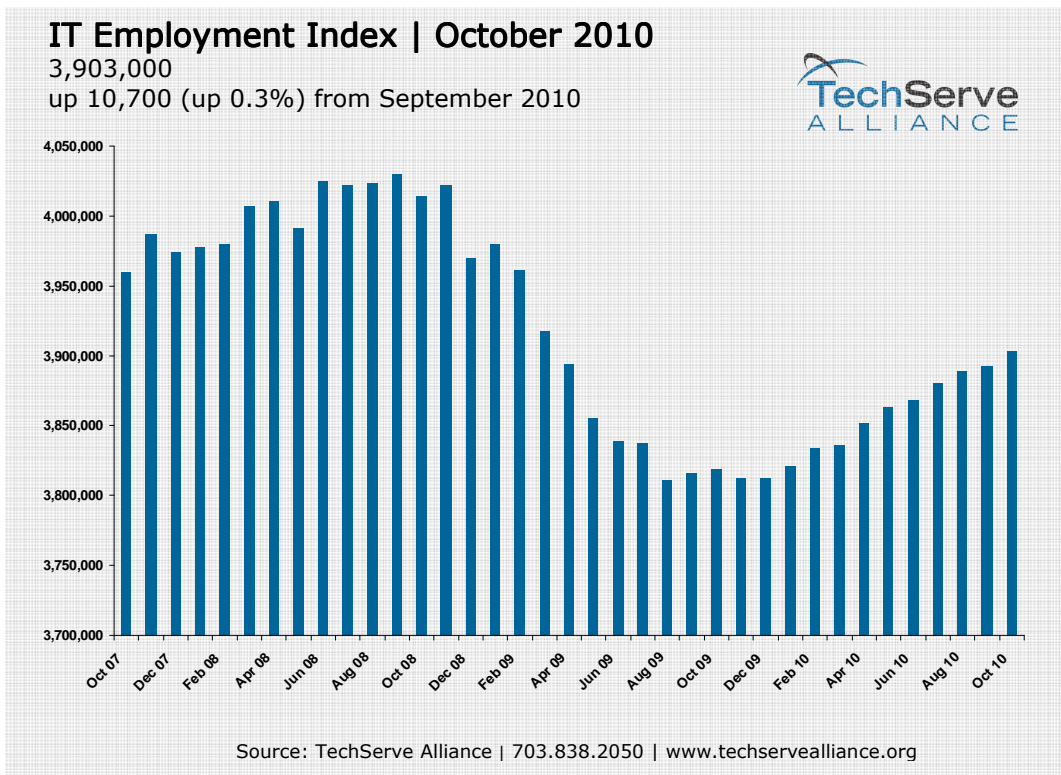
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IT Employment Posts Strong Gains in October

Alexandria, VA, November 11, 2010 – October saw continued growth in IT employment adding more than 10,000 jobs. Additionally, BLS's upward revision to September's employment data now reflects growth of 3,600 IT jobs, up from a previously reported incremental loss of 200 jobs.

According to a monthly index of IT jobs developed and published by TechServe Alliance, a collaboration of IT services firms, clients, consultants and suppliers, IT employment in October rose to 3,903,000 (0.3 percent). On a year-over-year basis, IT employment is up 2.2 percent compared to a 0.6 percent increase in total non-farm employment.



"There can be no doubt that the number of IT jobs continues to grow vigorously despite an economic recovery that many are characterizing as anemic," observed Mark Roberts, CEO of TechServe Alliance. "While analysts in some quarters pulled back on their optimistic projections based on the original numbers posted in September, we remained bullish. The revised numbers for September and strong showing in October have reconfirmed our optimistic projections for future job growth in the IT sector," commented Roberts.

IT jobs are found in virtually every sector and industry in varying degrees. The following table presents information about the total number of jobs in certain sectors that provide a significant amount of employment for IT professionals as well as to the number of all jobs.

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Technical note: TechServe Alliance's IT Employment Index is the first specific measurement of IT employment. This unique measurement of total IT employment is created monthly by studying the ongoing staffing patterns of a dozen IT and computer related occupations in 16 industries and industry sectors employing significant numbers of IT workers including the manufacturing, wholesale and retail trade, financial, information services, business and professional services, and education and health industries. The monthly IT Employment Index is based on U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) data, which is subject to monthly revisions, and therefore, the Index is revised accordingly. The IT Employment Index is also subject to annual revisions and was benchmarked in February 2010 with the publication of the BLS January 2010 employment report, which included revisions to several years of employment data. The next revision will be published in February 2011.
